Jachens Wright's Will

Georgia }
Eugene County } In the name of God Amen, I Jachens
Wright of the State and County aforesaid being sick
and weak in body but perfect in mind and
memory, thank be to Almighty God for the same,
but knowing the mortality of man, after recom-
mending my soul to God who gave it and
my body to the dust to be buried in a decent
manner at the discretion of my Executors &c.
touching my property and effects which with the
Almighty hath pleased to bless me with, (after
my debts are all paid) disposed of in the manner
following. (Wiz)

1st I desire & ordain that my beloved wife Asenath
Wright should abide & continue on the place we now
live on, keep the family together & have the entire
control of all my estate both real and personal
with this intent, that our children may be raised and
I should not be troubled with the family, having said
other persons with her hereafter named to assist her in
the prosecution of her business as she may see fit to
give the most judicious way of affecting the present

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253 of the Bible say that part of them that occurred consequent on the purchase of a certain family of Negroes viz. Joseph, Caroline his wife & their Children which I purchased of my Father in Law Walter Lewis, I wish this to be a cancel of that property taken, Perfidia, he said Lewis will take back the property on such terms as may seem to be equitable and that only he agreed to by him & Lewis & Co. & Co.

But if I cannot Wright should think proper to change her state of living into a married life, then in that case, I wish to state that the real worth of my Estate be ascertained & my wife receive a child's part & each Child an equal part of my Estate. Nevertheless if my beloved wife Ann with Ungeat should continue in a state of widowhood until our children are raised and schooled, I wish her then to in that case to enter into our property on her own right and a property the dwelling house that we now occupy together with three or four hundred acres of land attached to the same, whether or not this last named legacy be more or less than a child's part above mentioned &c. &c. Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Ann with Ungeat & Wiley Wright to execute this my last will & Testament disallowing & revoking all others.
