 Greene County In the name of the ever living God, Amen
 Zebulon Wright of said County being at this time in a health
 full of sound and disposing mind and memory, and desirous of
 disposing of my Estate and effects, do make and declare
 this my last will and Testament.
 In the first place, I direct my remains to be decently
 interred, by my Executors hereinafter named, and my debts
 if any be paid.

In the second place I direct that my estate both real &
 personal together with Stock of all kinds be sold, on such
 terms and at such times as my Executors hereinafter named
 may deem proper or expedient and advantageous, and from
 the proceeds thereof my Executors do pay my debts
 if any.

I do, by these presents, for the best regard that I have
 for my wife Nancy Wright, give & bequeath unto her
 Five Hundred Dollars and one negro woman Hannah
 For her my wife to make such disposition of household furniture
 as she thinks proper.

I do by these ^{present} for the love & regard that I have for my daughter Nancy, bequeath give & bequeath unto her One Thousand Dollars, William, Mary, Mapp, & Joseph, John Wiley and Frances Conkley & infant Child, One Thousand Dollars each - The control of which I give to my son Wiley Wright until they become of age and to be managed for their benefit.

I do by these presents, for the love & regard that I have for my grandson Clayton Milton Conkley, give & bequeath unto him Two Thousand Dollars - The control of which I give to my son Samuel Wright until he comes of age, to be managed for his benefit.

The foregoing distribution to my wife Nancy & my three daughters is intended & will put them upon equal footing with what I have previously given to my three sons, Wiley, William & Samuel.

Lastly, I direct that if after my debts are paid & foregoing distributions have been made, there should be a remainder to come from the sale of my effects - that it be equally divided between the five children, Wiley, Martha, Mary, William & Samuel, and the sixth portion which would have fallen to my daughter Nancy to be equally ^{divided} between her children & heirs of as above mentioned.

I nominate constitute & appoint my sons Wiley & Samuel Wright my Executors hereof, & hereby giving them full power & authority to sell my estate as herein before mentioned or directed & full & perfect titles hereunto to make

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal, this the fifth day of November A.D. 1816 & 1817.

Georgia } I, William Corry Senior of the County & State
 Green County } aforesaid, being weak in body but of a sound
 mind & disposing memory, knowing it is appointed unto
 man to die, do ordain this my last will and Testament
 thereby revoking all others, as touching such worldly goods
 as it hath pleased God, to help me with I bequeath
 in the following manner.

Item the 1st
 I give unto my beloved wife Jane Corry the
 following negroes, viz. - Mose, Charles, Sally, Caroline,
 Mary & Macky & Henry. the land & premises whereon I
 now live with all my stock of every kind, with all
 my household & kitchen furniture, with all my
 farming utensils during her natural life & after her
 death, I give & bequeath the above named negroes and
 plantation with the addition of two negroes more Edmon
 & Irwin with one half of all the stock & household and
 kitchen furniture & farming utensils to my beloved son
 William Corry.
