it a duty while in life to make a disposi-
tion of the property with which a kind
providence has blessed me with, I make
& publish this as my Last Will and
Testament, hereby revoking any or all
other wills heretofore made by me.
Item, 1st I will that my body be buried
in a Christian like manner suitable
to my condition in life.
Item 2d

I will and bequeath my whole
Estate both Real and personal to
my beloved wife Mary Ann Byrd
Item 3d

I will that all my debts be paid
by my Executors herein after appointed
without unnecessary delay, when and they
can be paid without the great a detri-
ment to my Estate.

Item 3rd

I will and bequeath my whole Estate both Real and personal to my beloved wife Mary Ann Byrd for the use of herself and her children except as hereafter excepted and at her death to be divided by my beloved wife among mine and her children.

Item 4th

I will and bequeath to my Daughter (by my first wife) Shady Ann Wilson, wife of James H. Wilson, the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars - the Amount with the advance already made I consider her full and equal share of Estate, without having any further interest in my Estate at the death of my beloved wife Mary Ann Byrd.

Item 5th

I will and direct that my Executor herein after appointed shall pay the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars left to my Daughter Mary Shady Ann Wilson (wife of James H. Wilson) out of any funds that I may have on hand at my death, or any funds that may come into her hands - but I do not wish or direct that my executrix be compelled to draw off of my Estate to pay this amount but that she pay from the proceeds of said Estate.

Item 6th

I will and direct that my Daughter Mrs Shady Ann Wilson shall have no further interest in my Estate after she gets the amount left her in the

will by Item Fourth.
Item 7th

I will constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary Ann Byrd my sole executrix. In whom I have all the confidence that my little Estate will be rightfully distributed among my children at such time as she may in her sound discretion conceive.
