I desire and direct that all my just debt
 be paid without delay.

Thirdly

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved grand
 son Amos M. Churchill Twenty five acres
 of land more or less part of Lot 1257 City
 Town in the first district of the County of
 said State. Also my parson lot and lot and
 and bedding, two small tables and table
 furniture, and he the said Amos M. Churchill
 M. Churchill is to take care of me and
 clothe me in good clothes and shoes and
 to furnish me plenty to eat, and to well
 and carefully take care of me while I
 live, for which if he the said Amos
 son shall will and truly do and
 perform, then the above sentence
 is to be his.
