be delayed of their rights.

Item third: I direct to my son Hugh one
hundred acres of land to be sold off
my home place adjoining Hugh and
the public road and then back to the
lithium land said land to be valued at
one thousand dollars.

Item fourth: I direct to my daughter Anne
Henry One hundred acres of land said
land adjoining a lot of land owned by

Item fifth: My daughter Catherine Davis I have
already made a deed to one hundred acres of

 before devised. I also give and bequeath
 to my wife money farming tools, stables
 stock provisions household and kitchen
 furniture sufficient for her comfort and
 support.

 youngest son Isaac & Susan Executors
 this my last will and testament
