 hereby revoking all wills by me at any time
 here before made, and first to come to hand to
 and who gave it and my partly estate I dispose of
 as follows

First I Franklin P. Buchanan of the County of
Lawrence and State of Georgia do by this my last
 will and testament in writing before of my wife
 present and according to the authority given
 bearing the date on the fourth day of
February, 1858, hundred and eighty eight,
 I give & bequeath to my wife Matilda Ann
Buchanan, one lot with slave house and
 and all other buildings on said lot, do as follows
 fronting 139 ft on North Street and back 119 ft
 and also all the heavy hold and kitchen furniture
 also all the tools, horses or hives, cattle and hay
 of land in the Sixth District of the county and
 State aforesaid, being a part of land lot 244, the
 twenty five acres of land in the first Dist of
Lawrence County and State aforesaid, apart of
 lot No 234, known as the Whitfield Place,
 adjoining lands Leahy, Clement and others

Also one town Lot No 5 in the Town of Logan
 apart of land lot No 254, fronting on the back side
 of the Public Square fronting 35 feet running back
 139 ft, also one town lot in the Town of
McCook in the County of Lawrence and State
 aforesaid in the 6 Dist Lot No 135, the being a
 fraction on Robinson Street sixty ft front
 running back sixty ft and bounded by Wm.
Law, Robinson and others, this being and

will that my wife Matilda Ann Buchanan shall
 have every thing above named during her natural
 life and at her death to belong to my son Edward
Buchanan, his entire estate I have set my
 hand and seal the February 4th 1858.
