 paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter
 named and appointed.

Thirdly

I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife
 Anne during her natural life all of my property
 both real and personal, and at her death, what
 may be left to be equally divided between my
 children and their representatives.

Fourthly

I hereby constitute and appoint my son
 John McWilliam my Executor of this my last
 will and Testament, this July 3rd 1833
