 Buckwell County, Georgia, to be made, in full
 possession for my family and for my only
 son my present wife, do with, and
 publish the following to be my last
 will and testament
 I desire that all my just debts be paid
 in the support of my wife, Mary and
 children, I leave in the hands of my wife
 the following property, to wit: the
 land whereon I live, together with all the
 farming tools and the present crop, all my
 stock, Hogs, cattle, sheep and hogs, horses, tools
 and kitchen furniture, my Negro man
 Amstead and Saborn, my Negro woman
 Hannah and Mough and Negro boy
 Henry together with all debts due me
 under the contracts of my executors here
 after named.

First It is my wish that my Executor should
 out of the above named property pay to
 my five children (part of Elizabeth the
 C. George and Henry an amount suffi-
 cient to make them equal to the sum
 herein after named, namely, black and
 said children and pay all just debts.
 the balance of said property of any left
 at the death of my wife Mary and of my
 be divided between my children.

Second To my Daughter Mary Ann Bryant
 I give my Negro boy by the name of
 George, about twelve years old
 Third I bequeath my Negro boy, Mills
 about nine years old.
 Fourth To my Daughter Anne Buffington my
 Negro boy Christopher about seven years
 old.

Fifth To my Daughter Eliza my Negro girl Henry
 about four years old.
 Sixth To my Daughter Harriette Mose my Negro
 girl Anna about four years old.
 Seventh To my Daughter Mary my Negro boy for
 about four years old.
 Eighth To my Daughter Rebecca my Negro boy
 Charles about two years old.
 Ninth The amount to be paid by my Executor
 to my five first children to be four hundred
 and Dollars each in case they should not
 be little Negro would that amount at the
 time the said named children came of age.
 Tenth I hereby nominate and appoint my
 wife Mary and my Brother Saml King
 Executors of this my last will and testa-
 ment, hereby revoking all other wills
 made by me. This 10th day of July 1852
 John King

 John King in his presence and before
 to be his last will and testament this 10th
 July 1852.

I should make a disposition of the property which

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary
Barnett & my Daughter Nancy J. M. Barnett
all the property which I now possess, said
said property consisting of, house and out-
cattle, land & sheep, also household and other
on furniture, also my present supply of corn
& fodder, pork, wheat & other provisions together
with the cotton which is on hand and all
money & debts which are due me, all of which
I give & bequeath unto my wife & daughter as
before said, for their own use and support
subject however to the following conditions.

That above property will all vest in my
wife during her life or widowhood, but if she
should die then the property will vest in
my daughter Nancy J. M. Barnett during
her single life, but if she should die, merely
then whatever of the property they may then
have no hand must be sold and the
proceeds equally divided between all the
rest of my children.
