with my family for their use and as much
of the estate and that as they will need and
the balance to be sold here also to keep
as much of balance of my personal property
as the family will need for their own use
and that the balance

I affirm I desire and desire that all my
just debts be paid without delay before
my appearance

I am I desire that my executor have full power
to do all such things I have and do
what money may arise from the sale of personal
property and keep the same without turning it
over and he must not pay interest on the money
which he has

I am I desire and desire that none of my land be
sold until the youngest child be of age &
until then any of my children can live upon
any of it by their paying Rent and any other
estate will go to the land probably and
not to the land itself

I am I give and bequeath unto my son James Wash-
ington my farm near

I am I hereby make, make and appoint my son
Richard W. Wash and Samuel Wash my
executors of this my last will and
testament
