Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried

mercy of the Lord and savior Jesus Christ.

Item 2nd I desire & direct that all my just debts
be paid without delay by my Executors
successors or assigns.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary
Barnett & my Daughter Nancy J. M. Barnett
all the property which I now possess, said
said property consisting of, house and out-
buildings, cattle, hogs & sheep, also household and kitchen
or furniture, also my present supply of corn
& fodder, pork, wheat & other provisions together
with the cotton which is on hand and all
money & debts which are due me, all of which
I give & bequeath unto my wife & daughter
to be used in their own time and at their
disposal however, to the following condition.

That above property will all vest in my
wife during her life or widowhood, but if she
should die then the property will vest in
my daughter Nancy J. M. Barnett during
her single life, but if she should die, merely
then whatever of the property they may then
have no hand must be sold and the
proceeds equally divided between all the
rest of my children.

Georgia. I, Sanford Hamrick, of said State and
 Brunswick County, County, being of sound and disposing
 mind and memory, do make this my last will and
 testament.

Item 1st I wish all my just debt paid as soon as
 practicable after my death.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my wife Anne Ham-
 rick during her natural life or widowhood, all of
 my property of every description to wit, all my land
 sold and hatched generation, all my stock by all
 kinds, also all my lands consisting of the same
 place, containing one hundred and twenty five
 acres more or less, being part of Russell being in
 said County.

Item 3rd At the death of my beloved wife Anne
 Hamrick, I desire that all my property then re-
 maining be equally divided between my children
 should and shall, either of any of my children
 be dead, and have children living, then they are
 to receive their dead parents share.

Item 3rd It is my desire that any estate be dis-
 posed of by any three with as little expense as
 possible, and direct that they be not required to
 advertise any of my property publicly before
 the land to be sold, but are hereby granted the
 privilege to sell or divide the same equally between
 three persons.

Item 4th I desire that after my death this my
 last will and testament be proved in the usual
 form, and by the Court of Ordinary admitted
 to record without the expense of appointing an
 administrator with the will annexed, or the
 usual formality in such cases and that all
 my property pass into the hands of my children
 at the death of my said wife and be by them
 equally divided as provided in Item 2nd of
 this my will.
