 hundred dollars principal of solvent
 notes also my ledger, & and
 and note books also all my books
 of every kind & character except
 mention in

my unsettled and open accounts
And also the share of one thousand
Dollars in Cash

Item 9 I give and bequeath to my dear
Daughter Sarah Caladonia Freeman
half of all my household and kitchen
furniture in my possession prior and up to
the time of my second marriage
together with my farm and all my
Said give bequeath and devise to my

The tract of land except that portion
conveyed to the G. C. & M. R. R. for right
of way purposes. However as the G. C.
& M. R. R. place being lot no 242 in the
5th district of said County containing
two hundred and fifty acres (250)
more or less.
