and proper, both as respects myself and family,
that I should make a disposition of the property
with which I am provided, and have blessed
me, I do therefore make this my last will
and Testament hereby revoking and an-
nulling all others by me heretofore made.

First. I devise and direct that my body be buried
in a secret and Christian like manner
suitable to my condition and condition
my life, my soul I trust shall return to
God who gave it; as I hope for salvation
through the merits and atonement of
the blessed Lord and Redeemer Jesus Christ.

Secondly. I direct that my beloved wife Lucretia
Jenkins pay all of my just debts without
delay.

Thirdly. I direct unto my beloved wife Lucretia
Jenkins during her natural life my
entire estate, both real and personal
of every description, whosoever to be used
by her for her reasonable and support
freely and fully without limitation
or restriction for the time of years.

Fourthly. It is my will and desire and I hereby direct
that upon the death of my wife my entire estate
be equally divided between my children
to wit William J. Jenkins, the children of my
deceased son Allen J. Jenkins, Alfred Jenkins,
John R. Jenkins and Perry J. Jenkins, or
in case any of my said sons or
life should die before any of my
said share shall go to their children if
they have any.
