

George Williams by the name of George Williams & Williams, having various reasons of his own had disposition of my estate during his family so became first and equal to me and I further wrote.

Item 1. I direct that all my just debts, if any exist at the time of my death, and the expenses of my last illness and funeral be paid as soon as practicable.

Item 2. I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Bettie E. Williams, for her natural life or widowhood, except six lines of former and future marsh

suppose, all of my property, both real and personal, of every description,

by the extent that my said wife shall have marry again, then it is my will and desire that upon the distribution of my estate as hereinafter directed, she shall receive as her full share and interest therein, five hundred dollars either in cash or property to be selected by her (with the consent of the appraisers) Item 3.

Balanced at that sum. In the event of my said wife marriage, and after the deduction of the five hundred dollar given her in that event, to me the case

she does not marry again at the time of her death (and after the expenses of her last illness and funeral shall have been paid) I will and direct that my entire estate (except one acre of land), including the natural income thereof, shall be equally distributed in kind among my children & between

in due descent by families, viz William Henry Williams, Isabell Williams, Lydia A. Pennington, John D. Williams, and Geo. T. Williams, James D. Williams, George G. Williams, Sarah J. Green, Ruth Pennington, Lydia C. Williams, Virgil Williams, Burkhardt J. Williams, Alfred Williams, Alice Williams and Guy Williams.

Item 4. It is my will and desire, that in the distribution of my estate in kind, as provided by Item 3, there shall be three commissioners appointed by the ordinary, of said county, to have duty to settle the appraisement paid estate and to divide it into the several parcels of above, and by lot, or other fair means, to set apart and deliver to each party his, her or their share, equalizing said share, if necessary, by balance in money, if no hand, or by the ledger among themselves; said appraisers and commissioners to be bound to faithfully and impartially discharge their duty so much, and to make return of their acting and doing in the premises to said ordinary, as evidence of the distribution of my estate under this will. The one serving shall except from my estate in Item 3, so that whenever he leaves the house in any house place, and which is possessed and held, or used to the purpose of a burial ground for my family and their descendants.

I hereby nominate and appoint my son George E. Williams and Sidney E. Williams, Executors of this my last will and Testament, but beyond a return of six months and a presumption of my prosperity at the time of my death.
