 be required to make.

Article 3

I nominate and appoint my beloved
 son James C. Whitworth my executor
 to carry out this will, and direct that
 no unnecessary expense be incurred as to
 property will be of small value, that
 no inventory be made or appraisement
 had, but that he proceed at once to
 divide the said property as specified.
