 furniture, and to my daughter Sarah
 one cow and calf and bed and furniture
 and to my daughter Elizabeth one cow
 and calf and bed and furniture
 the rest of my property to be in State

to my wife Mary during her natural life and
 then to be equally divided among my children
 I have given the name of each child as follows
 William my eldest son my second daughter
 the third being the fourth from the fifth daughter
 the sixth being the seventh from the eighth
 the ninth

Scoble, with my son William & the trust of land & plantation where I live with on the Charlotte river known as the Mr. Simon place and the half lot land on Rousley creek where the Samsomville is located from Rousley & away as far as creek or of lot No 25. 1st Burwell County, N.C. land of James Davis & others, both lots in said County of Burwell, these two lots to be the joint property of the said Anne R. & William I do hereby give

first time, should my last wife die first then the whole of it to my son and daughter in law & my son, if he should die before then that I have should be as my son or of them during his life and at his death to be equally divided between all my children who were in life and the children by purchase of land as may be made the said I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Mary Anne Simon wife of Thomas Simon all that I own in life free from the debt of Rousley Creek's liability of the present in my father's land, and at his death to be equally divided amongst his children there in life & the children by purchase of land as may be made the following parts of land to wit: one half in the County of North containing two hundred & fifty acres being lot No 25. Originally 1st day of June 1699 a small tract adjoining land of Burwell County 1st day of June, and also a certain lot of land in the County of Burwell County containing not collected containing 200 acres adjoining land of Burwell County, and also a certain tract of land of Burwell County & others, also the undivided half of the land of land, in said County of Burwell, known as the Thomas Middle place on the road leading to the Samsomville and the estate of John Samsom, adjoining land of John & others in the above lands, valued at two thousand and one hundred dollars I give devise & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Anne Simon Rousley for during her life, after from the debt & interest befalling is instead of her present or any future husband.
