

Minutes of the Court of Ordinary

Monday 6th July 1835

Present their Honors Lewis Levy, John King, Elisha S. Barclay and Absalom Stolcombe

Ordered by the Court that Myles Warwick and George Philips be exonerated from the bond they have given in Court for the full and fair management of the estate of Frederick Davidson Dec'd by the Executrix Rhoda Davidson and Jacob Warwick executor upon their giving Elisha England and Abraham Davidson for security for the faithful management of the same in the amount named in the aforesaid Bond and that Jacob P. Warwick on application be released from the executorship of the same from the time of filing of said Bond

Habersham County } In the name of God I men of Clement Matters being in a very low state of health but in my proper mind and senses make this my last will and testament I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Rachel Matters and my two youngest children Martha Matters & Mary Matters all my plantation beginning at the mouth of the Creek barrow running down the river to Ezekiel Stolcombs line thence with said Stolcomb line until it intersects with Warmack line thence with Warmack's line to the above named creek thence thence down said Creek to the beginning corner including all the lands that I own below said Creek on Broad River the same my wife Rachel Matters and my youngest daughter Martha Matters and Mary Ann Matters to have during the natural life of my wife Rachel Matters or widowhood together with all the other property appertaining to the said plantation with the exception of one mare and Colt and a still which are to be sold together with all my land being on Broad River

above the Mouth of the above named Creek and the plan-
tation that I bought of Brazill Addison whereon William
Watters now lives to pay my debts and the balance of the
money which may be derived from said sale over and above
what pays my debts to be equally divided among my first
wife's children - I have nominated and appointed
William and Obadiah Watters my executors to this my
last will and testament
