Georgia ————— In the name of God. Amen.
Habersham County, I Harry Phillips. widow of
George Phillips, late of said County deceased, being in feeble
health but of disposing mind and memory, calling to mind
the frailty of my body, do make and ordain this and no other
to be my last will and testament. Principally and first
of all, I give and recommend my soul in to the hands of
Almighty God, who gave it and my body to the earth
to be buried in decent Christian Burial
as touching such worldly estate as I may be possessed of
or due me at my decease, I give and dispose of in the following
manner. I give to my six grand children, sons and
daughters of Joseph P. Phillips (to wit), Francis Elizabeth,
Nancy Emily, Leonia Caroline, Sept. Warren, Cathrina
America, & George, all my part of the estate of the said
George Phillips. Decd also my bed & furniture Trunk &c.

together with all the effects that I may be possessed of at my decease
to be equally divided between my said Grand Children so that
each one may receive an equal share of the principal and interest
arising from the proceeds of said Estate when they arrive at the
proper age to receive the same so that the oldest receive equal with
younger ones and should either of them die young my will is
that their part be equally divided between the surviving ones
I do hereby appoint Joseph C Phillips my sole executor to carry out
provisions of this will into effect
