Stephen Cantrell has heretofore made application to
the Clerk of this Court for letters of administration on
the Estate of Moses Cantrell late of Said County deceased
and that said application has been published in a public gazette
agreeable to law. and no objections being shown to the
contrary - It is therefore Ordered by the Court that
the said Stephen Cantrell be and he is hereby appointed
Administrator of and upon the Estate both real and
personal of the said Moses Cantrell. and that
the Clerk of this Court do give letters of administration
accordingly upon the said Stephen Cantrell giving Bond &
Security & taking & Subscribing the oath in terms of the
law in such cases made and provided. and that
George Saylor, William Henderson Sen, Jst Jst Holcombe
Joshiah Underwood, Isaac Baker, be & they are appointed
apprisers of the Estate of said deceased

Aforesaid In the name of God Amen
do this day make and ordain this my last will and
testament never having made any other
Item First I desire and direct that after my death
my body be buried in a manner suitable to my circumstances
in life. this I believe will be done by my children who
are dearer to me than all else on earth
Item Second, I will and bequeath to my son
Robert Allan my old negro woman Sal. and my
negro woman Lizzy and her issue forever

Item Third, I will and bequeath to my son Henry Allan my old negro woman Phillis and my negro woman Mary and her Spue forever = Item Fourth, It is my desire that my youngest daughters Emily & Elizabeth shall live together with my sons Robert & Henry on the plantation where I now reside and that my negro woman Eliza shall be kept with them my Executors so long as they may live together on said plantation, and afterwards I will and bequeath to my son Henry Allan the said negro Eliza with the condition that he the said Henry shall pay to my son Thompson Allan the sum of two hundred dollars; otherwise I will and bequeath her the said negro Eliza to my son Thompson Allan, I also will to my son Thompson one bed and furniture for the same. Item Fifth, I will and bequeath to my daughter Sarah E Parks formerly Sarah E Allan one cow and calf to be given to her when ^{my} Executors think proper. I also will to my daughter Sarah my best sorrell mule. I further will to my daughter Sarah an equal share of all my Books to be divided among my three daughters Sarah, Emily & Elizabeth. Item Sixth, I will and bequeath to my daughter Emily C. Allan one bed and furniture for the same. I also will to my daughter Emily a share of all my Books to be divided as specified in Item fifth. Item Seventh, I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth J. Allan one bed and furniture for the same. I also will to my daughter Elizabeth a share of all my books to be divided as specified in Item Fifth. Item Eighth, I will and direct that after my death all my stock such as mules horses cattle sheep & pigs, all my farming blacksmith & carpenters tools, all my house hold and kitchen furniture, such as my table, clock, spoons crockery, pots, ovens & various articles too tedious

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to mention, be kept on the plantation where I now reside for the use and benefit of my children who may live on said plantation as directed in Item Fourth Item Ninth - I constitute and appoint my two sons Robert Allan & Henry Allan Executors to this my last will and testament, This 16th day of July 1847

& at her request & in the presence of each other as
witnesses & that she executed the same freely without
compulsion so far as they know or believe and that she
the said Hannah was at the time of signing the same
