I Henry Brewer of the State of Georgia and County of Habersham, being at this time in a very bad State of health in body, though in a perfect mind and memory and knowing that life is uncertain, and that the living must all die and leave this world, in consequence of which, I make and publish this my last will and testament. I first give my body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian decent manner at the discretion of my executors, my soul I recommend to the hands of Almighty God that give it me - as to my worldly estate, I give devise and bequeath in the following manner to wit. Item, first, I give to my son Freeman Brewer all my tract or parcel of land, lying in the County of Franklin, and State aforesaid, on the water of Clarke's creek, adjoining the Red hollow tract of land to him and his heirs forever, being one hundred and fifty acres more or less.

Item 2^d I give to my son Jackson W. Brewer, one hundred acres of land, to be measured of the upper end of tract of land whereon I now live in the County of Habersham and State aforesaid, on Bastanalle creek, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3^d I give to my son Henry M. Brewer, one hundred acres of land, to be measured of the tract aforesaid, adjoining my son Jackson W. Brewer land down said creek, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 4th I give to my beloved wife Polly Brewer all the rest and residue of my lands, goods and chattels, stock of every kind, to her own use, disposal and benefit, for the purpose of raising my family that is with us, during her widowhood, or life, it is my will that she give Henry M. Brewer, a horse, beast, when he becomes of age, it is my will that if my beloved wife should die or marry, the residue of the land and stock should be sold, and the proceeds divided, equal among all of my children not named above in this will, it is my will that as long as my daughters should remain unmarried, and should wish to have a home on the premises, that the sale and distribution should not go into operation.

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Lastly I nominate and appoint my dear and Beloved wife
Jolly Brewer and my son Jackson W. Brewer, sole executor
and Executor to this my last will and testament, hereby
revoking all other and former wills by me at any time
heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal the sixteenth day of October in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three

3rd This my last will and testament for Alefare Morris and my son John Morris, to carry into effect the above described wishes as my lawful executor and Executrix, after the specified time elapses for an equal division of all the remaining property among all my heirs - Signed in presence of us, this tenth day of June 1843
