children, until the youngest arrives at the age of twenty one years
and then during the lifetime of said Alfare Morris

2nd It is my will for said Alfare Morris to give to my heirs,
as they become of age, and leave her, as much property as those then
have already married and left, if she can do it without discomforting
herself and minor heirs, but optional with herself.

3rd This my last will and testament for Alfare Morris and my
son John Morris, to carry into effect the above described wishes
as my lawful executor and Executrix, after the specified time
elapses for an equal division of all the remaining property among all
my heirs - Signed in presence of us, this tenth day of June 1843
