Item 1, I will and bequeath unto my five
sons Powell Hanson Martin and Charley and George
the notes that I hold on Deborah Sarratt
of the amount of sixteen Hundred dollars
to be equally divided between them their
heirs and assigns for Ever

And I will and bequeath unto my two
son in laws as follows James M. Hain one hundred
and thirty ^{five} dollars to be paid to him when
collected out of another that I hold made
by A. P. Hain to Sarratt and indorsed by
the said Sarratt to me and also

I wills and bequeath unto my other son in law ~~John~~ one thousand and twenty five dollars out of the same notes and to pay other two daughters namely Origin & Alminda two thousand dollars each out of the above note and the balance of said note to be equally divided with my five sons first namely thirdly I will also bequeath unto my beloved wife Matilda England all my other effects excepting one slave horse and my smallest lot of stores and two negroes fourthly I will that my two negroes be namely Howell and Sybil to be sold with my shoes and horse to pay my Just debts Fifthly two notes I hold on Adam Petrus all to pay my Just debts I further will and bequeath unto my wife Matilda one lot of landed lying in the County of Coweta in the State of Georgia and distinguished in the map of said County by No 95 in the seventh district as marked my hand and seal this the 9th day of April 1831
