I Peter Kinsey of the State and county of Habersham County aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make and signify this my last will and testament, first I give my soul to Almighty God who gave it me, secondly I will that my body be decently buried in a plain Christian like ~~State~~ and as to my worldly goods with which it has pleased god to bless me I begeth and dispose of them in the following manner to wit, to my dear wife Cloe Kinsey I give one hundred and twenty five acres more or less of lot N^o 122 in the eleventh district of Habersham County lying on the west side of the Rabun Road to be her property untill death then the titles of the lands to be given up to Joseph Kinsey as his property for the maintenance of the child untill death, I give to my wife Cloe Kinsey one Cow and calf, I give to my wife Cloe Kinsey one feather bed and shits and table and one mare to be her property, I give to my wife Cloe Kinsey all the Kitchen Furnishings and one spinning wheel to my wife Cloe Kinsey, to my daughter Mary Kinsey I give and begeth one feather bed, one Cow and Calfing and calf, I give and begeth to my daughter Elizabeth Brooks one feather bed one Cow and yearling, I give and begeth to my daughter Tabitha Kinsey one feather bed one Cow and calf, I give and begeth to my daughter Artemiza Kinsey one Cow & calf I give and begeth to my son Elijah Kinsey one mare and

one bay Horse, I give and begeth to my son Joseph Kinsey
one bay Horse, I give and begeth to my son William Kinsey
one sett of Blacksmiths tools and one sett of Wagon Irons
and timber to fell out the wheels, the remainder of my
property to wit, cattle Hogs and Land and one bay filly
and one still, one brope cut saw and one block, one broad
axe, this property all to be sold and after all just debts
are satisfied, then the balance of the money to be equally
divided among the Ayres that has had nothing.
