Doth give & bequeath unto Samuel Morgan Junr. & John Morgan & Jonathan Morgan his three sons one Negro Man by the name of Tony & one Negro Woman by the name of Dinna, and one Tract of Land lying & being in the County of Franklín & State aforesaid on the waters of Webbs Creek two

hundred & fifty acres joining to Samuel Hadden & others. I also give & bequeath unto Thomas Morgan my son one Dollar

I also give & bequeath unto Martha Garrison & Patsy Paris & Elitha Cochrane my three daughters, all my house hold and

Kitchen Furniture, I also give & bequeath unto Nancy Garrison & Margarito Cook my daughters one Dollar each.

I also give & bequeath unto William Forsyth a husband of my daughter

Rhoda one Dollar. The above stated property to remain & be for the support of my self & wife Nancy, during

life & then to belong to the above named persons as is above stated. I further appoint

Samuel Morgan Junr.
