and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make this my last
will and testament that is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend
my soul into the hands of almighty God
that gave it and my body I recommend to
earth to be buried in decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my executors
nothing denying but at the general resur-
rection I shall receive the same again by
the almighty power of God. And as touch-
ing such worldly estate wherewith it has
pleased God to bless me in this life I
give demise and assign of the same in
the following manner and form viz.
first I give & bequeath unto my well beloved
brother Alfred Hughes my negro boy
known by the name of Chick to be his
right and property provide my father
& mother do have possession and the use
and assistance of him during their and
each of their natural lives and then to
belong to my brother Alfred Hughes as
above stated Secondly I give and bequeath unto
my father and brother Samuel & G. Hughes &
Abriel Hughes all the interest right and title
that I have in the and to a certain quantity of property
now in their possession and my two horses viz.
a saddle horse & a brown horse for the pur-
pose of paying & satisfying my debts and
funeral expenses and if there is any thing
and as they think proper

gives my other goods and chattels for the purpose
aforesaid. And I do hereby constitute and
make and appoint the said Samuel Houghy
& Gabriel Houghy my executors of this my
last will and Testament. And I do hereby utterly
and freely disallow revoke and desannul and every
other form and Testament withs legacies bequaths
and executors by me in anywise before named
withed & legualled ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my wille and last will
& Testament. In witness whereof I hereunto set
my hand & seal This first day of February
eighteen hundred and twenty nine (1829)
