Methodist Church on the Poplar 3prings Road, Hall County, is an interesting and important distorical marker, placed by the Georgia Historical Commission n commemoration of the brave nen who formed a company and left from this church to engage in numerous battles hroughout the Civil War.

During the four years of ighting this company of 115 men paid a tremendous price in casualties. The message on the aistorical marker reads:

"Co. D, 27th Ga. Inf. Colquitt's Brigade, C.S.A organized here in early 1861, fought at Williamsburg, Seven Pines, Seven Days Battles at South Mtn., Md., Sept. 14. 1862, against great odds, men of this company withstood four attacks from a heavy force of Federals, in a great display of bravery. Later they fought at Antetam, Fr edericksburg, Chancellorsville, Charleston, At Olustee, Fla., Feb. 20, 1864, they kelped drive the Federals from Florida until Lee's arrival, they helped hold in check Grant's army at Petersburg, Va. They fought last at Bentonville, N.C. and surrendered at Durham, N.C., April 26, 1865."
