The Abercrombies apparently came to Hall from South Carolina via Jackson County. There are many Abercrombie marriage records and other court records found in Jackson County prior to the creation of Hall. One of the early militia districts in Hall was named for Corrol Duncan, son of Young Charles.

A widow, Nancy Abercrombie, was granted lot 30 in 12th district, Nov. 14, 1825. She was listed as living in 154th district. Warren County.

James Abercrombie was an original settler in Hall County. It is certain that he came from South Carolina. He was the second James Abercrombie enumerated in the 1790 census, Laurens County, S.C. His wife Ann, or Mary Ann, and he disappeared from the county after they sold land in 1798. The couple had at least three sons and several daughters.
