Chamblees settled here

At least one family by name of Chamblee had moved to this section of Northeast Georgia about the time of the crea-

tion of Hall County William Chamblee was enumerated in the 1820 census of Hall. It is believed that William Chamblee moved to

Cherokee County around 1834 or 1835. There is an official statement concerning the family deposited in the State Archieves, Atlanta.

"Georgia. Cherokee County. Before me, the undersigned

officer authorized by law to administer oaths, in person

appeared W.F. Chamblee (grandson of William), who, upon oath, deposes and says that there were six Chamblee (Chamlee, Shamblee, Shambly) brothers who came to this

country; four settled in Virginia and two in South Carolina near Spartanburg.
"My grandfather was William Chambley. He had a brother named Washington Chamblee. William Chamlee

brother named wasnington Chambee. William Chambee married Dorcas Sego of South Carolina. They had six boys viz: MARTIN, TILLMAN, JARRETT, ROBERT, BILL (Wm.) and ENOCH. They had four daughters viz: Lucinda. and Polly (twins), Janette and Dorcas. He with his family lived in Hall County, Ga. So far as I know, he never owned a farm until after the Cherokee Purchase. He then bought a

home near Hickory Flat in Cherokee County, Ga.

"Of the above named brothers TILLMAN CHAMLEE was my father. He was born Nov. 22, 1809, and died April 30, 17, in Cherokee County. He married Kindness Breedlove Light, daughter of Obediah Light and Mary Moore. Obediah Light owned a plantation on Flowery Branch Creek in Hall County, Ga. Kindness Breedlove Light was born Sept. 20,

16, and died March 21, 1892. My father, Tillman, bought of the Cherokee Strip a home near Hickory Flat. All of his

brothers each owned a farm in Cherokee County, Ga. sherribed and sworn to before me this the 3rd day, __, 1937. Notary Public Cherokee County, or Georgia State at Large. Signed: W.F. (X his mark) Chamlee." and Kindnes

The marriage of Tillman Chamlee and Kindness Breedlove Light is recorded in Book A, Marriages Hall County courthouse Cert. No. 626, dated Dec. 22, 1830. The children of the couple were: George, William Franklin, Luvinia, Ernestine, Emaline, Anne, Kindness and Caroline. Native of Scotlan

According to other family records Jacob Chamblee, was born in Edinburg, Scotland, and came to America. He settled first in Virginia and then migrated south and owned land in
