One of the Civil War companies formed in Hall County was Company 1, 24th Georgia Regiment.

Captured at Gettysburg, Pa. June 2, 1863. Died of chronic diarrhea at Ft. Delaware, Del. July 17, 1864.

**LITTLE, J.J.** — Private. Wounded in eye, resulting in loss of sight Gettysburg, Pa. July 3, 1863. Captured at Cedar Creek, Va. Oct. 19, 1864. Paroled Feb. 1865. (John J. Little married Martha C. Martin June 25, 1865)

Nine men of Co. 1, 24th Regiment. "Glade Guards Volunteer Rifles are known to lie beneath the sod in the Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond, Va.: James M. Bowlin, W. Cannon, Aaron Clements, Hiram H. Hampton, John W. Herrin, R.J. Martin, David White, Armistead Whitlock and John A. Whitlock. Several other members of this company were killed in this vicinity and may also be entered here with their graves unmarked.

In 1917 R. Martin, Dealer in General Merchandise, Leno, wrote a letter to Mrs. S.C. Riley, Gainesville, A quote from this epistle:

"Andrew J. Poll came from South Carolina, was in Florida war. He rose from private to rank of Major later on he was appointed Brigadier General of this Regimental District. He

was killed in the Battle of Gettysburg, Pa. July 2, 1863. He was buried in the Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond, Va.

WATTS, Adam — Private. Captured Gettysburg, Pa. July 2, 1863. Died of smallpox at Ft. Delaware, Del. Nov. 22, 1863.  
WHITE, David — Private.

WILLIAMS, Andrew — Private. Killed at Cold Harbor, Va. June 1, 1864. Buried in Elmira, N.Y. 1865. (Andrew Williams married Margaret Presley June 17, 1868, Hall County.)  
WINTERS, Mounan — Private. Severely wounded in 1864. Admitted to U.S.A. Field Hospital Burkittsville, Md. Sept. 1864. Transferred to Co. E, 3d Battalion Georgia Sharpshooters June 8, 1863. Captured at High Bridge, Va. Apr. 6, 1865. Released June 22, 1865. (Appears as Marlan, Merryman, Manman, and Mounan Winters. Merryman Winters married Martha Ann Collins Dec. 2, 1860, Hall County.)  
WOOTEN, Benjamin C. — Private. Died at Farmville, Va. June 18, 1862.  
WRIGHT, Larkin — Private.  
WRIGHT, William — Private. Discharged, debility, at Confederate State Hospital, Petersburg, Va. July 3, 1862. (Born in Hall County, 1831. William Wright married Maude Orr Apr. 19, 1864, Hall County. Buried at Timber Ridge: W.M. Wright, died May 7, 1904, age 73 yrs.)  
YARBERRY, Lemuel — Private. Took oath of allegiance to U.S. Government at Knoxville, Tenn. May 23, 1864. Not shown on official list: Timber Ridge Baptist Cemetery: Richard Miller, born June 7, 1834, died Feb. 4, 1915, Co. I, 24th Georgia Infantry C.S.A. and Eliza Jane Miller, born Dec. 29, 1848, died Dec. 21, 1901. Nine men of Co. I, 24th Regiment. "Glade Guards Volunteer Rifles are known to lie beneath the sod in the Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond, Va.: James M. Bowlin, W. Cannon, Aaron Clements, Hiram H. Hampton, John W. Herrin, R.J. Martin, David White, Armistead Whitlock and John A. Whitlock. Several other members of this company were killed in this vicinity and may also be entered here with their graves unmarked. In 1917 R. Martin, Dealer in General Merchandise, Lula, wrote a letter to Mrs. S.C. Riley, Gainesville, A quote from this epistle: "Andrew J. Poll came from South Carolina, was in Florida war. He rose from private to rank of Major later on he was appointed Brigadier General of this Regimental district. He represented Hall..." (second page of letter lost.
