"Jacob Husht from Wm. Smith...Land granted to Clement Mobley Nov. 6, 1786, 56 acres on Beaver Creek, a branch of Broad River. Bounded by Clement Mobley, Robt. Scots, George Miller, Sam Martin (land laid out to John Waggoner) conveyed by Clement Mobley to Wm. Smith. of 18 pounds...Lawful Current Maggoner) conveyed by Jacob Husht...(signed) Wm. Smith. Margaret Smith."

The children of Jacob and Rachel Hosch were two sons, Mathew and Jacob, and two daughters, Rachel and Ann Lathcart. The descendants of the daughters are untraced. Family tradition states that the son Jacob died at a young age.

The son, Mathew Hosch, was born 1785 and died about 1838 in Walton County, Ga. He married Mary Hill, born 1793, Fairfield District, S.C., and died between the years 1855 and 1870 in Red River County, Tex.
