I. John McConnell, Sr., of the State of Georgia and County of Hall, being 2 2 weak and low of body but of perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body, knowing that is appointed for all time to die, do resign my soul unto the hands of God who gave it not doubting that I shall receive the same again by the Almighty power of God as touching this earthly property whereof it has pleased God to bless me in this life to divide and discose of the same in the following (that is to say) in passing I leave and bequeath unto my well beloved wife, Nancy Montgomery McConnell, all my household and kitchen furniture, also one negro woman named Ann, during her natural life, then said negro to revert and become the property of my son, John McConnell, Jr., one chestnut sorrel, Mary, saddle and bridle, my stock of cattle and sheep. It is my will that all my debts and eghtracts will be fully completed according to law it is my will and I do order. I give and becueath unto my well beloved son, John McConnell, Jr., my mansion house, farm, and mill and that appertains to the same, and two hundred and fiftyeight acres of land when can be considered as a part of my real or personal estate, giving and granting to my well beloved son discretionary authority to purchase the same. If said be out of my personal property so as not to reduce it under the balance of the said property at par. The land and mill allowing the said John McConnell, Jr., and strictly requiring him to pay to the Legates of my estate sixty-four dollars for the use of said farm and mill, one negro boy named Jerry until the first day of January next, in full compensation for the same I gave and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter, Elizabeth Montgomery, one negro boy named Jerry, on condition that the circumstances of my estate will justify that same to be estimated at par with other donations. I do bequeath unto my grandsons, James and John McConnell, and John and James Montgomery, one lot of land in the fifteenth district of Early County and known of said district by lot number 263. I do hereby
