The Simmons marriage is recorded in BOOK A MARRIAGES, Hall County, Ga. Cert. no. 916 "John D. Simmons was married to Polly Ann Rylee, Nov. 3, 1836. Wm. R. Wellman M.G." "Polly" is a nickname for Mary Ann Rylee was a granddaughter to Rev. James Rylee the Revolutionary Soldier who moved to Hall County in the 1820's.

The 1852 Tax Returns of Hall County show that John D. Simmons was living in the 385th District and was owner of 1000 acres of property. Some of John Simmons lineage is found in the "GENEALOGY OF THE LEWIS FAMILY."
