Georgia Hancock County } In the name of God Amen.
I Benjamin Battle being at this
time in a low state of health but of perfect
and sound mind and memory - and willing to mind
that it is appointed for man once to die -
Do on this 27th day of February one thousand
eight hundred and nine make and ordain
this my last will and Testament in manner and
form following to wit;

Item - I give and bequeath unto beloved wife Sally
Battle her heirs and assigns the tract of land and
plantation that I purchased of James Rogers con-
taining two hundred and eleven Acres lying in
Warren County - Also six Negroes called Brutus,
Peter, Chain, Fawn, Jim and Simon, Also one

one bay Horse called Tabb. & one sorrel Horse Polly
 two feather beds and furniture, one desk one Biron
 folding Table, one large Trunk, one pine chest, all
 glasse, & every Ward, all my Kitchen furniture and
 all my plantation Tools, my Oxen and Cows,
 and the half of my Brandy Casks and I require
 her to pay all my Debts except what my son
 Jesse will be required to pay. and I give
 her half of my Stock of Cattle Hogs and Sheep
 &c. I give and bequeth to my son Jesse Battle
 his him and assigns forever the tract of
 land & plantation whereon I now live con-
 taining three hundred and sixty three acres
 and a half I also give him seventeen
 Negroes, called, Delcy, Isham, Victor, Delilah,
 Joe, Emiby, Harry, Lancaster, Isabell, Hannah
 Lucy, Grace, Phillis, Cary, Ned, Anthony and
 Nathan. Also one black Horse called Limerack
 one bay Mare Cato, One sorrel Mare, Also
 three feather Beds and furniture two large
 Trunks and one Walnut folding Table.
 I also give my son Jesse one half of my
 Stock of Cattle, Hogs and Sheep, one North-
 ward Still, one Corn Capboard, half of my
 Brandy Casks. my Black Smith Tools and
 I give him my part of father's estate that
 will be due to me at the death of my
 Mother and I require him to pay four hun-
 dred dollars towards discharging the debts

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that is now owing by me -

And finally I nominate, constitute and appoint my
son Jesse Battle, my brother Isaac Battle and
William Caban sole and sole executors to this
my last will and Testament, hereby revoking
and disannulling all former wills by me made
and proclaim this as my last will and
Testament -
