Hancock County } In the name of God Amen. I Elizabeth
 Barnes of County & State aforesaid being of sound mind
 & memory but low in health and knowing that it is appoint-
 ed unto every man to die, do make this my last will & testa-
 ment, revoking all others heretofore by me made in manner
 and form as follows that is to say. It is my will & desire
 that all my just debts be paid previous to any distribution
 otherwise &c

1st Item. I give & bequeath unto my two youngest sons Burwell
 S. Barnes & Lewis B. Barnes a certain tract or parcel
 of land containing about one hundred & four acres of
 land that I purchased of St & James Tripps adjoin-
 ing the land I now live on westwardly, now part
 in cultivation also one Walnut Sideboard & four
 feather beds & furniture with all the rights apper-
 taining therunto to be equally divided between the
 said Burwell S. Barnes & Lewis Bryant Barnes to them
 and their heirs forever

2nd Item. I give and bequeath unto my two other sons & four daughters
 namely Thomas Barnes & James Barnes Mary Sanders,
 Sarah Lewis, Elizabeth Sanders & Christian Grigg a
 certain negro woman by name Rachel and her children
 also one negro boy by name Arthur. also one tract
 of land in Columbia County containing two hundred
 acres adjoining Cranes land formerly on the waters of
 Miller Creek granted to Lewis Barnes & two half acre
 lot in the Federal Town on the Oconee River Baldwin
 County to be equally divided amongst them and their
 heirs forever.

3rd Item. I give and bequeath unto my Executors which will
 be hereafter named as trustees a certain negro girl by
 the name of Silvey her increase or benefits for the
 sole use of my daughter Patience Tripps with her
 children during her natural life & if she the said
 Patience Tripps should die before her youngest child
 arrives to the age of twenty one years old or marries

my will & desire is that my
 Executors or named trustees or executors shall not
 keep the aforesaid negro Silvey & her increase

in their possession until the youngest child of the said
Patience my daughter, shall arrive to the age of
twenty one year, old or marries, then & at such
period my will & desire is that my trustees or
executors shall make an equal distribution of
the S. Negro Selvey with his increase and benefits
if any amongst all the children of S. daughter
sharing equally alike between them & their heirs
forever.

4) Item. I give and bequeath unto my grandson Thomas D.
Daniel one feather bed and one mans saddle to
him and his heirs forever.

5) Item. I give and bequeath unto my seven grand children
namely Lewis Daniel, Janny Daniel William Daniel
Cornelia Daniel Evelina Barnes, Elizabeth Barnes
& William S. Barnes five dollars each knowing
they are heretofore provided for - I do this in
remembrance of my affection -

And lastly I do nominate constitute and appoint
my four sons Thomas Barnes, James Barnes, Lewis
& Lewis B. Barnes Executors to this
my last will & testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
this 18th July 1820.
