My estate I wish & will to be divided and disposed
 as follows viz.

I will that all my Just debts be paid with all
 expenses.

I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Colquitt
 of her natural life to be by her possess & enjoyed one
 of the two tracts of land & premises wherein I now live
 by the names Kings Hills tract & John Loggys tract and
 at her death to be the property of my son John H. Colquitt

Furthermore bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Colquitt
 negroes namely Sam, Winney, Dicky, Tucker & Friday
 of her natural life & at her death to be equally
 divided between the heirs Sarah Randel, Walter J. Colquitt,
 John H. Colquitt to belong unto them & their heirs
 forever.

I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Randel
 her heirs the tract of land I purchased from Mr. Joseph
 also five negroes namely Winney, Dicky, Sampson
 & Billy them and their increase forever to the prop-
 erty of her & her heirs forever.

I give & bequeath unto my son Walter J. Colquitt also
 a tract of land known by the name of the Hick tract
 five negroes namely Rose, Arthur, Dicky, Jabez & Dick
 & their increase forever to his own & proper use at his
 age at twenty-one years of age.

I will that my youngest son John H. Colquitt the son
 of all of the two tracts of land mentioned above of which
 half is bequeathed during her lifetime to my wife

& also five negroes, namely Kella, Frank, Toby, Ann & Jacob & them & their increase forever to his own use when he shall arrive at the age of twenty years.

Item 6th I will & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Randall John H. Colquitt the tract of land which in the land lottery & was distinguished as lot 31. eleventh district Wilkinson County to be equally divided between them.

Item 7th I will that my two sons Walter J. Colquitt & John H. Colquitt be made equal to my daughter Sarah out of my stock & furniture that is to say one horse, Bridle & saddle, two cows & calves & pigs & two good feather beds & furniture & ready

Item 8th I will & order that when my grand son Randolph shall arrive at the age of seventeen my executors shall give unto him a horse & one hundred dollars.

Item 9th I will & bequeath the remainder of my personal stock, House-hold & kitchen furniture & plant tools unto my beloved wife, Nancy Colquitt & like & at her death to be equally divided between my three children Sarah Randall, Walter J. & John H. Colquitt & furthermore that the arising from Crops & the increase of stock be as much as may be necessary to completing the same to my two sons.

Item 10th I will & bequeath if either of my three children above named shall die without an heir that portion be equally divided between the survivors.

Item 11th I will that all the property which is to come in an heir of the estate of Simon Holt senior be the property of my beloved wife during her life & at her death be equally divided between my three children to them & their heirs forever.

Item 12th I will that the tract of land known by the name of the land whereon Jonathan Carter & Sally now live be theirs in free possession and enjoyment of five years from Christmas 1818. be

the direction of my Executors in such manner as they shall think proper.

And I will & appoint my wife Nancy Colquitt executrix & Edmund Rindel & my two sons when they shall arrive at the age of twenty one years Walter S. Colquitt & John H. S. Colquitt Executors to this my last will & testament disannulling all other wills & testaments - declaring them null & void.
