I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Kilgore during her natural life or widowhood that part of land which lies on the north side of the road leading from Shivers Mill to Rowellton where I now live and I also leave her 3 negroes Sereny and her 2 children Jim and Levi after her death the negroes to be equally divided between John Kilgore and Abigail Lee
19. Item. I give and bequeath to my said wife 1st choice of one of my horses and first choice of a cow and calf, also two beds & furniture and one trunk.

20. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Charley Kilgore all the old tract of land containing by estimation 414 acres more or less but my said wife is to have the plantation where I now live during her natural life or widowhood. I also give him 4 Negroes, John, Fanny, Siller and Abram.

21. Item. I give and bequeath unto my ^{son} William Kilgore 80 acres of land part of the tract whereon he now lives more or less and 3 Negroes Peter, Leroy and Lazar.

22. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Ralph Kilgore 2 Negroes David and Dinah.

23. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Jambulin one negro girl named Bitha.

24. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Dunn one negro girl named Cynthia.

25. Item. I give and bequeath to my son John M. Kilgore one negro girl named Lema.

26. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Abigail Lee one negro girl named Aggy.

27. Item. I give and bequeath to my son Benajah Kilgore 20 Acres land more or less whereon Horatio Fielder now lives including the Spring for a home for him and mother's sister also one negro woman named Voss to be hired out for the of six years and then to be divided between Benajah and his
