I bequeathed to my wife Mary Lovett the whole of my estate during her natural life and after her decease. I bequeathed to my daughter Mary Lovett one negro boy named Groun. And after the death of my wife Mary Lovett the remainder of my property is to be equally divided between my heirs. ^{Richard Lovett} Selah Castleberry, Abner Newman, Thomas ^{Richard Lovett} Lovett, Rebecca Castleberry, Samuel ^{James Lovett} Lovett, ^{Ephraim Lovett} David Lovett, Mary Lovett and Fenna Warren.

I bequeathed to Jonathan Newman one dollar. I bequeathed to Freeman Newman a son of Jonathan Newman an equal division with the ^{my wife} ~~formentioned~~ heirs if in existence at the time of the division. I leave my wife Mary Lovett ^{my wife} executrix to this my last will and testament. 6th November 1819.
