First I give unto my four beloved Sons, (to wit
 Reuben, Simeon & Francis, all my negroes
 thirteen in number, also all my land & place
 which I now live, to be equally divided betw
 four Sons, as they become of age, Together
 the ready money and debts, and all m
 from the sale of my house hold goods & personal
 property, after paying all my just debts,
 will, constitute, make & appoint my
 James M. Egan, & Irwin J. Hitchcock, the Sole
 of this my last will & Testament, an
 fully do allow, revoke & disannul all
 former Testaments, wills, Legacies, beque
 & bequests by me in any wise before nam
 & before attested, ratifying & confirming this
 to be my last will & Testament, In Witnes
 have hereunto set my hand and affixed
 thirty first day of May in the Year of
 thousand Eight hundred & Seventy one,
 sealed & pronounced and declared by the said
 Traywick as his last Will & Testament
