 of land which I have lately drawn in the late 3 $\frac{1}{4}$
 Land Lottery Number 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in the District of Early 4 $\frac{3}{4}$
 County unto him his heirs and assigns forever 56 $\frac{1}{4}$
 I further give unto my son William Maddox my
 two Beds and furniture unto him his heirs and assigns
 forever, And it is my will and desire that the balance
 of my estate should be equally divided between -
 my three Children viz William Maddox, Samuel 56 $\frac{1}{4}$
 Maddox & Sally Bagby. And lastly I do appoint
 my son William Maddox Executor to this my -
 last will and testament January 16th 1821. 68 $\frac{1}{4}$
