Ordered that the nominated Executors, Thomas Lundy and
Starling Evans, in the will of Abner Addison deceased
be qualified and the said will recorded. Whereupon
the said Thomas Lundy & Starling Evans were duly
qualified as Executors of the said last will and testament

Georgia. In the name of God Amen. I Wm. H.
Benson of the County of Hancock and State aforesaid being
in a low State of Health but of perfect sound mind and
Memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for man
to die, do on this 16th of October 1821. make & publish
this my last will & testament in manner and form following
to wit

1st Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly Brown
her heirs & assigns forever, all that part of my estate
both real & personal which came to me by her con-
sisting of Land, Negroes, Stock, house-hold & Kitchen furniture
plantation &c.

2^d Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife the whole
of the balance of my estate both real & personal,
during her natural life. I also give to my wife

Polly Brown all my notes & accounts that are due me & direct her to pay all my just debts.

3rd Item. At the death of my wife Polly Brown I give and bequeath unto the heirs of Michael Hany ~~and~~ the four following Negroes, to wit, Clary, Mark, Billy & Amatted; the balance of my estate which did not come by my wife Polly Brown, I give and bequeath unto my own brothers & sisters and their heirs forever.

4th Item. And should my wife not survive and so as to be capable after my decease of making a will, as she is also in a low state of health & it is her desire I do, at her death, give & bequeath unto her three sisters, Jane Hazy, Martha Battle and Sarah Morris all of that part of my estate both real & personal which came to me by her to them & their heirs forever.

And finally I nominate & appoint my friend John Hazy Sen & Brother Hollinger Brown whole & sole Executors with power to carry my will into effect, hereby revoking all former wills by me made & proclaiming this to be my last will and testament, the day & year above written
