In the name of God Amen, I Zadock Stinson knowing it is appointed for man to die and feeling my dissolution approaching tho' of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made - In the first place I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent manner by my Executor and as touching such worldly goods as it has pleased the Almighty to bless me with, I give and bequeath them in the following manner & viz, As to debts I owe none except my Tax, that I wish to be paid first.

2^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved nephew Sevin Turner all the ready money, notes and accounts that I may be possessed of, Stock of hogs and every other species of property whatever at my death except the tract of land I own between this and Sparta to him and his heirs forever.

3^d I give unto my little nephew Samuel Turner son of the above Sevin my tract of land lying on both sides of the road leading to Sparta to him and his heirs forever.

4th And lastly, I do by these presents nominate and appoint my Nephew Sevin Turner my sole Executor to see this my last will carried fully into effect I witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th Feb^y 1822.
