In the name of God Amen I Henry Graybill
Senior of the State and County first written being of a
sound bodily health but of perfect and sound mind and me-
mory (thanks be to God for it) and knowing it is decreed for
all men to die, do make ordain and constitute this my
last will and Testament. Viz: my body I give to the
earth from whence it came to be buried in a decent
Christian manner and my soul I commit to God who
gave it in hope of a certain and joyful resurrection at
the great day of Judgment when the secrets of all hearts
shall be manifested. And as for what worldly goods wher-
ewith it hath pleased God to bless me, I dispose of them
in the following manner

Item I lend to my beloved wife Polly Graybill all my lands on
the South side of Sandy River together with the house & Mill,
house hold Furniture, Kitchen utensils, all my stock of Hogs,
Cattle, Sheep & Hags. Also the four following negroes
Tony, Grant, Hagar & Lewis with their increase during
her natural life and at her death all the said property to
be equally divided among all my heirs.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Philip Graybill two negroes
to wit William & Sall to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Henry Graybill Junior
two negroes to wit, Sancho & Jack to him and his heirs
forever.

Item I give and bequeath to the children of my daughter Eliza
betta Junigan the sum of two hundred dollars to be paid
at my death if my Executors have funds if not at the
death of my wife and to be equally divided among them.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Michael Graybill two
negroes to wit, Charles & Simon to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Graybill two negroes
to wit, Peter & Nathan to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Shropshire
Hagar (on condition that returns the negroes to
my estate) two negroes to wit, Maria & Eli.

her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my two sons Michael and John Graybill all my land on the North side of Sandy Run including the hundred Acre which Michael Graybill lives on to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever - finally I constitute and appoint my Son Philip Graybill Henry Graybill Junr. Michael Graybill & John Graybill Executors to this my last will & testament.

Whereupon it is ordered that said will be admitted to record, and that letters testamentary be granted to Henry Graybill & Michael Graybill two of the nominated Executors in said will, to whom after being duly qualified letters were granted accordingly.
