I, Henry Peck of the County and State named being in sound mind and memory do in order to settle my worldly affairs make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time heretofore made.

I lend unto my beloved wife Judith Peck during her natural life or widowhood my land plantations whereon I now live my stock of horses, cows, hogs, sheep, plantation tools, household and kitchen furniture and all other of my estate not otherwise disposed of in this my will. I also lend unto my beloved wife Judith Peck during her natural life or widowhood eleven negroes, viz. Sarah, Jacob, Sue, Poll and her four children Sarah, Harriet, Ruth and Phenton and Lucy and her child Hannah and it is my will that my beloved wife Judith have the liberty to give what she may make by this property loaned to her to which of my children or grand children she chooses.

I give and bequeath to the children my son Leonard had by his first wife my Negro man Jacob to be delivered to my son Leonard at the death of my wife Judith Peck and to be kept by my son Leonard during his natural life for the education and support of said children and at said son Leonard's death said man

months and the proceeds to be equally divided between the children
said son Leonard has by his first wife.

Item 3 I give to my son William Winfrey Park my land and two negro
viz, Linderella and Mimas already received and at my wife's death
one Walnut table and desk.

Item 4 I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Votmston one dollar
and to the heirs of said daughter Elizabeth's body I give one
negro woman and her five children Handy, Gabriel, William
Emory and Martha now in possession of said daughter
Elizabeth to be kept and employed by said daughter Elizabeth
during her life for the education & maintenance of said
daughter Elizabeth's children and at said daughter
Elizabeth's death, the negroes named in this item I wish
to be equally divided among said daughter Elizabeth's children

But should said daughter Elizabeth die without leaving
any child or children then it is my will that the negroes
named in this item should be divided among my four sons
Leonard, Pocket, James and Wm W. Park, so as to give
Leonard two shares and the others one each —

Item 5 I will and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Tripp in
addition to what I have hitherto given to her one dollar
and to her children I give four negroes Lucy and her
child Hannah and Ned and big Hannah and their
increases, the said negroes to be kept by my wife Judith
during her life or widowhood for the support and educa-
tion of said daughter Nancy's children and at the death
of my wife Judith Park the negroes named in this item
to go into the possession of my son Wm W. Park, to be held
out to him for the education and support of said daughter
Nancy's children and at the death of said son Wm W. Park
or when any of the said daughter Nancy's children comes
age it is my desire that the said negroes named in this item
be equally divided among said daughter Nancy's children

Item 6 I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Mary Ann
the proceeds of my son Hiram Park deceased the sum
of five hundred dollars to be raised out of my estate after

the death of my wife Judith Park to be kept in my son W^m Park's hands until said Grand Daughter Mary Ann Park comes of age or marries, but should said Grand Daughter Mary Ann Park die childless it is my will that this bequest should be divided between my four sons Leonard, Locket, James and W^m Park so as to give Leonard two shares and the other sons share each.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Surrel one dollar in addition to what I before given her

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Hunter one dollar with what I have given to her heretofore

Item 9th It is my will and desire that all the property owned to my wife Judith during her life or widow here and all other of my Estate not disposed of should at my wife Judith Park's decease or marriage be so divided among my three sons Locket James and my son Leonard's children by his first wife as that my son Leonard's children by his first wife may have two shares and my other sons one each the said property to be kept and used by my son Leonard for the support and education of S. children and at his death to be equally divided between the children of his first wife.

Item 10th And I hereby constitute my beloved wife Judith executrix and my son W^m Park executor of this my last will and testament in witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four

I Abednego Wright of the State of Georgia, Hancock County being of sound mind & understanding sensible of the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the approach thereof knowing also what preparations essential to catastrophes which sooner or later effects the end of all mortals, do make and establish this my last will & testament, the distribution of which are as follows. As to my body or remains of me after my decease, I leave totally to the management of my executors who will hereafter be mentioned to inter as they see cause hoping at the same time nothing necessary to complete decent burial may be neglected & that they will not only in but in all the rest of my desires act according to the tenor hereof. It is my pure desire that all my lawful debts or contracts of whatsoever dignity may be satisfied settled & paid off out of the property of mine that may remain or herein named or over & above the following bequests -

Item 1st I bequeath to my beloved wife Susannah Wright two negroes Anthony & Fanny his wife to dispose of at her own will & pleasure in fee simple - I leave to my wife during her or widowhood two negroes Sam & his wife Phillis I also leave to my wife the plantation whereon I now reside called Oak Hall together with the dwelling house, house
