It is also my wish that my estate should be kept together so as to promote the general interest of my family in such a manner as my executor may in their judgment think most profitable to my estate until my son Benjamin shall arrive to the age of twenty one and at such time fit and proper persons to be appointed by the Court of Ordinary to make an Appraisement of all my personal estate and divide and make an equal dividend among my legates and divide in like manner mann as my children may become of age provided my daughter Martha should marry before she shall become of age she is to have her legacy as above stated.

It is to be particular understood that it is my wish that all my estate should be equally divided among my wife and children and at the time of my youngest son arriving to the age of twenty one. That my land be divided among all in equal shares and after the death of my wife to be divided among my children.

I nominate my beloved wife Elizabeth Askeew and my confidential friends James Askeew and Britain Simms my Executors to this my will. In testimony whereof I do hereunto subscribe my hand and seal this 7th day of March 1822.
