Item. It is my will & desire that my debts & funeral expences be first paid out of my estate.

Item. I give & bequeath to my three grand children that is to say the two children of my son Rhodius, & the eldest daughter of my son Saban two hundred dollars each after they arrive at lawful age or marry, & on failure of all or either to arrive at lawful age or marry the said sum so bequeathed to them shall remain & be considered as a part of my estate and disposed of pursuant to the residuary clause of this my last will and testament and shall not vest in them or either of them until lawful age or marriage - And the money to be kept at interest by my Executors until such time it shall vest in them or shall fail so do by death of said legatee or either of them.

Item. I give & bequeath to my son Benjamin five dollars.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Saban five dollars.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Rhodius five dollars.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Bradford five dollars.

Item. It is my will and desire that all my estate real and personal be sold by my Executors as soon after my death as the same can be lawfully done for the purpose of raising funds for the payment of debts and legacies.

Item. All the residue of my estate come and above the payment of my lawful debts, & raising a fund to meet said legacies I give & bequeath to my daughters Susan H. Temple & Candace Franklin share & share alike, and should all or any of the aforesaid grandchildren die before lawful age or marriage, I give & bequeath the sum so bequeathed to them to said Susan H. Temple & Candace Franklin share & share alike their heirs & assigns.

Item. Lastly, I nominate, constitute & appoint Leaborn Gony & Thomas junior Executors to this my last will & testament I hereby ratify & confirm what they shall do in and about the premises. I hereunto set my hand & Seal this 26. October 1822.
