

In the name of God Amen. I Sarah Simmons of the State of Georgia & County of Hancock being in good health & sound mind memory do make this my last will and testament, in manner and form following viz.

Item 1st. I give to my son James Simmons one negro by the name of Henry to him and his heirs forever.

Secondly. I give to my son Benja^a Simmons one negro by the name of Daniel to him and his heirs forever.

Thirdly. I give to my son Jefe Simmons one negro by the name of Juns to him and his heirs forever.

Fourthly. I give to my son John B. Simmons two negroes by the names of Ted & Lucy and one feather Bed and furniture, two horses the black and the Bay horse by the name of Jolly. Likewise the balance of the stock of all kinds that I have in my possession, the Still, one pair of Cast Irons, the house & Kitchen furniture & the plantation Tools of all kinds to him and his heirs forever.

My Will is that my son James Simmons & Benja^a Simmons be my Executors of this my last Will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty -
