I William Masfellan being weak of body but of perfect mind & memory, think proper to make this my last will & testament in the following form & manner. First I consign my soul to him that gave it me & my body to the earth in Christian burial & as to what it has pleased God to bless me with as to temporal things I wish to dispose of in the following way (viz);

Item 1. It is my will that all my property both real and personal belong to my beloved wife Francina Masfellan during her natural life and after her death to be brought together and be equally divided between my sons, William Masfellan, John Masfellan, Henry Masfellan, James Masfellan, Polly Masfellan & Nancy Masfellan.

Item 2. I also wish that after the death of my wife that all the Plantation tools together with the set of Carpenter tools be equally divided between my three sons, John Masfellan, Henry Masfellan & James Masfellan.

Item 3. It is also my wish that after the death of my wife that all the Stock & Household furniture of every kind be equally divided amongst my sons & daughters (viz); John, Henry, James, Elizabeth Price, Peggy Price, Polly & Nancy Masfellan.

Item 4. I also wish that after the death of my wife that the land whereon I live be equally divided amongst my three sons, John Masfellan, Henry Masfellan & James Masfellan.

Item 5. I wish & do hereby nominate and appoint my three sons John Masfellan, Henry Masfellan & James Masfellan my executors to act on & fulfil the duties required above in this my last will and testament and also to pay all my just debts out of any monies belonging to the estate. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal in the presence of the subscribing witnesses the day & year above written.

The last will & testament of William Massellan, late of this County, deceased, being produced in Court by James Massellan Henry Massellan & John Massellan the executors therein named & being duly & fully proven in its execution by James W. Fannin, John Veazey & James Veazey the attesting witnesses. It is Ordered that said Will be recorded and that the Executors therein named be qualified as such.

Whereupon the said John Massellan, Henry Massellan and James Massellan were duly sworn as executors of said Will & qualified - and received letters testamentary in the premises.

I Henry Long senior being weak of body but of perfect mind & memory and knowing that it is ordained for all the living to die have thought proper to make this my last will & testament. My soul I commit to him that gave it me and my body I consign to the earth in Christian burial form, and as to my worldly estate which it becom please God to bless me with I feel inclined to dispose of in the following manner.

Item 1. I Will to my daughter Patsy Randle all the property both real & personal that I have given her previous to this date.

Item 2. I will to my son John Long all the property that he has received from me up to this date.

Item 3. I will to my son Henry Long all the property personal which I have heretofore given him.

Item 4. I wish the money that Malcom Johnston owes me to be applied to the payment of the Land in Monroe County that my son Henry & myself have bought & yet unpaid for, lying on Joby in the Creek N^o 24 & N^o 25 in the 12th district of said County.

Item 5. I will to my beloved wife Ann Long during her natural life

there to be equally divided amongst my three children, to wit, Poley Randle, John Long, & Henry Long, with this exception that the negro woman Jude was included in my former gift to my son Henry, but that she should not be taken from my wife so long as she lived, afterward to go to Henry Long.

And it is my will that my wife Ann Long and my son Henry Long be and act in this my last will and testament as Executors. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal in the presence of this 17th day of Sept^r 1824.
