As relates to my worldly estate which it has pleased God to bless me with I dispose of in the following manner after the payment of all my just debts, by my executors, viz, And whatever I may be the proprietor of at the time of my death both real and personal I wish my wife Keturah Miller to have without reserve or equivocation whatsoever after the payment of my just debts aforesaid.

And it is further my wish that Jas. M. Fannin and my wife Keturah A. Miller be and act as executors to this my last will and testament:
