

In the name of God Amen. I Samuel Hall of the Town of Sparta in the County of Hancock and State of Georgia being in a weak State of bodily health, but of sound & disposing mind and memory, do make and Ordain the following to be my last will and testament.

In the first place. It is my will that all my just debts be paid as soon as that amount can be collected from my out standing debts —

Item I do lend unto my beloved wife Patience during her widowhood the house & lot whereon I now reside together with the out buildings and appurtenances thereunto belonging, also my negro girl Lucinda, two feather bed, bed shades & furniture, the Walnut dining Table & one pine Table, six chairs, together with all the residue of my household & kitchen furniture except such articles as shall be hereafter otherwise disposed of in this will. also two Cows & Cows.

Item I do give & bequeath unto my daughter Leah Wingate, the lot of land in Sparta joining the lot whereon the houses stand that we at present live in; one Cow, 1 feather bed & furniture & one large pine chest;

Item I do give & bequeath unto my daughter Harriet, the lot of land in Sparta joining the lot purchased from Jacob Todd on the East, & Hamilton Street on the South; one feather bed & furniture & one Cow.

Item I do give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Hazard the two lots of land in Sparta, known

Lots were conveyed to me by Rountree & Taylor.
Reference to the deed will fully explain their boundary
also three Acre land purchased from Charles Hancock
joining Lucas & Town Lots, one feather bed & furniture,
& one Cow -

Item I give unto my son Elijah ~~the~~ houses & lot purchased
from Jacob Todd in the Town of Sparta. reference
to the deed will show its situation -

Item. I give unto my son Theodore the three lots of
land in Sparta conveyed to me by Jacob Johnston
situate on broad Street known by N^o seventy, ~~seventy~~
-one & seventy-two. reference to said deed will
fully explain their boundaries & situation -

Item It is my will that my negro man Tom be
sold (at the discretion of my Executors) & the
proceeds equally divided between my two daughters
Leah Ellingate & Sarah Hazard.

Item It is hoped that my other children Wingate, James,
Samuel, Joseph, Tabitha Smith & Peggy Beggan,
will not think themselves neglected, or unfairly
dealt with, that I have bequeathed my estate
to my younger children; as they are in a depen-
-ant situation. I do therefore request that ^{they} be
content with receiving one dollar each as a
token of my affection for them -

Item It is my will that all the residue of my estate
including my outstanding debts, be equally divided
as soon as collected and my estate is settled, also that
all Hancock County Will Book H 1811-1815 have been
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Wife on his marriage or death, be sold & also divided
between my following children, viz, Theodore Lusk Wingate,
Harriet & Sarah Hazard.

I do hereby nominate and appoint my sons, James
Hall and Elifake Hall with my wife Patience Hall
to carry the foregoing into effect. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed
my seal this fourteenth day of March in the
year of our Lord, eighteen hundred & fourteen.

The last will & testament of Samuel Hall deceased
was proven in Open Court by the Oaths of Thos
Foster, and J. S. Alford two of the subscribing

testamentary issued to them accordingly -
