

Last Will and Testament of George Mellock Dec^r

In the name of God Amen. I George Mellock of the County of Warren and State of Georgia being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the Mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my Executors, hereafter named. Nothing ^{doubting} but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give, demise & dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly a negro boy named David that is after she becomes eighteen years of age, also, I give unto my daughter Agatha, two negroes named James and Hagar, that is after she becomes eighteen years of age, Also I give unto my son George de la Hayette all my real estate, together with all my stock and working tools, when he becomes twenty-one years of age. This is to be allowed him exclusive of his equal proportion of the negroes, with the rest of my two children before mentioned. To his wife and heirs, also

I request, and it is my desire that my dearly
beloved wife Fribee shall enjoy and hold all
the balance of my property during her widowhood.
In case of her marrying it is my desire that she
may hold fourth part of the balance of property
before mentioned during her life time; the rest
of the property, to be equally divided between my
Children, Polly, Agatha & George De la Hayette; that
is when my son comes of age (21 years old)
And my Executors shall see in any wise what-
ever that the said fourth part of property is in
a likely way to be wasted, I leave it in their power
to secure it, and put it to the best advantage for
the children; and at her death that one fourth
part of property, as also their increase to be
equally divided between the children, Polly, Agatha
& George De la Hayette. Further it is my wish,
that my Executors have my two daughters, and
more particularly my son educated. Lastly I
constitute, make and Ordain Ezekiel Smith and
John Smith, as also my son George when he
becomes of age, Executors, and my wife Fribee
Mistress Executrix of this my last Will and
Testament. And I do hereby utterly disannull, revoke
and disallow all and every other former Testaments,
Will, Legacies, bequeaths and Executors, by me any-
-wise before named Made and bequeathed; ratify
-ing and confirming this and no other to be
my last Will and Testament.
