 memory thank be given unto God. Calling unto
 mind the mortality of my body and knowing
 that it is appointed for all men once to
 die do make and Ordain this my last will
 and testament: that is to say principally and
 first of all I give and recommend my soul
 into the hands of Almighty God that gave
 it and my body I recommend to the earth to
 be buried in decent Christian burial at the
 discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but
 at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
 again by the mighty power of God: and as touch-
 -ing such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased
 God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose
 of ^{the same} in the following form and manner: That I lend
 to my beloved wife Abby Allen during her
 natural life my Negro woman Stacey and
 after her decease for the said Negro woman to go
 - then with her increase from this time to be equally
 divided amongst my three young children ^{Abigail}
 H. Allen, Harris Allen, and Briant Lee Allen, I
 also lend my wife the land and plantation whereon
 I now live during her natural life and after
 her decease for the same to descend to my son
 Harris Allen. I also lend my wife during her
 natural life my negro man Ben and after
 her decease for the said negro man Ben to be
 sold and the money arising said sale to be
 equally divided between my six oldest children

Elizabeth Norton William Allen, Basha Barned,
 Harry Allen, Polly Allen and Dykeah Allen.
 I also lend my wife three Cows and Calves in
 choice, one bay mare by the name of Fan
 also twelve head of Hogs her choice four head of Sheep
 her choice also one bed and furniture her choice
 also my largest Table, six chairs, 1 Chest called my
 (Wife's) Chest, 1 earthen Dish, six dished plates one wheel
 and one pair of Chard, 1 Flax wheel my smallest
 pot, six head of Lye all the last mentioned pro-
 perty after the decease of my wife to be equally
 divided between my three youngest Children, Malinda
 Harris and Brient. I also give my wife and
 her family a plentiful support of provision for one
 year I also give and bequeath to my daughter
 Malinda one negro girl by the name of
 Minerva and in case of the death of my
 daughter before she arrive to the age of maturity
 or Marries, then for the said negro to go to Harris
 and Brient Allen I also give and bequeath to
 my son Harris Allen one negro boy by the name
 of Richard and in case of the death of my
 son before marriage or he arrives to the age of
 twenty-one year then the said negro to go to go
 to my daughter Malinda and my son Brient. I
 also give my son Brient one negro by the
 name of Washington and in case of the death
 of my son before he arrives to the age of twenty
 one or Marries then and in that case the said
 negro to be equally divided between my daughter

Malinda and my son Harris Allen and their
 heirs forever. I also give my daughter Polly one
 feather bed and furniture. I also give my
 daughter Fanny one bed and furniture. I
 also give my wife one womans saddle. I
 give Willis Spear the bed and furniture whereon
 he now sleeps. I give all the residue of my
 estate not heretofore devised to my six eldest
 children and in case either of them should
 die before they arrived to the age of twenty-one
 or married then for his ^{her} or their part or parts
 to go to the then surviving ones last mentioned.
 I also constitute make and on my wife and
 my son William Allen as the sole Executrix
 and Executor to this my last Will and testament
 and I do hereby utterly disannul and revoke
 all and every former testament, Will, and
 legacy bequests and Executors by me made or
 in any wise made Will and bequeathed, ratify
 - ing and confirming this and no other to be
 my last Will and testament -
